The ashes for Ash Wednesday come from burning the palms from the preceding year's Palm Sunday. On Palm Sunday, the Sunday before Easter, parishioners are given palm fronds to represent the fronds that people waved as Jesus returned to Jerusalem for the final time before he died.

Ash Wednesday is a time when we can think about doing the right thing and saying sorry for some of the wrong things that we have done.

You are God's people, his saints. God loves you.


You should be kind and gentle, and patient and forgiving, and loving like God.
