Pupil Steering Groups

Children have met for a third time and have reflected on all the positive work they have done this year including aiding in planning Health and Well Being week, our WoW initiatives, Fair-trade Fortnight and our Universal Children's day. The children have begun to look forward to next year and have new ideas for the upcoming year.

School Council (Miss Scragg)

The children have been able to meet to discuss their ongoing role across the school. The children reviewed and updated their School Council Questionnaire which has been completed by all of the children across the school. As always responses have been very positive with the children being able to say that they enjoy coming to school and that they always feel safe and know who they can talk to if they have any worries. They were also happy that the children across their school always try their best. When asked if they would change anything the majority of the children said no and that they really liked to come to school. A couple of children asked if they could have more playtimes and some were a little more specific about more PE, maths or more science.

This year the school council also asked about the children's experiences of RE and Collective Worship. The children all said that they liked their RE and the times when they came together in Collective Worship. Some of the children were able to say that they thought other children also did their best and that they knew how well they were doing in RE because 'the teacher tells me'.

All of the responses were very positive with only a few children not being certain about their answers – because 'sometimes I don't like coming to school because we have to do hard work' or 'sometimes I want to play at home'

Eco Schools

During the summer term children throughout school took part in activities to promote Eco School ideals including the importance of recycling and conservation work through a range of different subjects. Year Two Eco Ambassadors also launched a competition in which children were asked to create Bug Hotels to help our own local wildlife. Children were also asked by the group to create posters to promote eco-school ideals and to participate in a walking initiative called 'Walking for Well-being'. The children engaged wholeheartedly in all of these activities and produced some fantastic work! All children also received their WoW badges for taking part in our 100 Laps (Rainbow Walk) in memory of Sir Tom Moore and to raise money for Halton Haven.

RRSA

As a school we strive to promote the rights of the child and ensure all children receive what they are entitled to. The RRSA committee planned some fantastic activities this year focusing upon children's rights including holding events such as our Universal Children's day, when the children all came into school wearing something Blue and raised money for a fantastic charity. As a school we have also reapplied for our Rights Respecting Schools Award.

Fair-trade

The Fair-trade committee have continued to meet this year and although we have been unable to have our annual Fair-trade stall the group have helped children across all year groups explore what Fair-trade is and why it is so important. As a school we have also maintained our Fair Achiever award status.

Health and Well-Being Group

The children have continued to focus on the wellbeing of our whole school community. The children helped to organise a Mental Health and Well-being week in which they were able to experience a range of different activities related to their own well-being. There were links to a range of different stories including Ruby's Worry and the Worrysaurus. The children were also lucky enough to have a visit from Life Education which was fantastic. This year we have also maintained our 5 Ways to Well-being award.

Anti-Bullying Ambassadors

The group once again met to discuss their role and the children felt that it was really important that we celebrated the importance of friendship. The awards were ready to give out on the last day of term when children had the opportunity to nominate a child in their class who they felt was deserving of this award. Sports Funding

We have also used the funding to purchase sports equipment for our school playground to support the delivery of high quality PE and sport throughout the school day.

Enrich Education

This term all children have been given the opportunity to take part in two enrichment days provided by Enrich Education. The children have taken part in both a Geography and a Science themed day with cross curricular links with PE. The sessions gave the children the opportunity to support both their Science and Geography knowledge while keeping active. The sessions were enjoyed by all the children and staff.

Creative Steps Dance

This year we have used our PE and Sports Funding to purchase a new dance programme to support the planning and delivery of dance throughout the school. The dance programme has been provided by Creative Steps and this term Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 have had the opportunity to take part in dance sessions from the company. These sessions have also provided invaluable support and training for all teaching staff, helping to further enhance our provision of high quality PE lessons.

Sports Week 2022

During sports week the children took a part in a variety of events including our 'Obstacle Relay Race For Alder Hey'. The children all enjoyed the day and received a special St Bede's medal designed by our Year 2 Sports Ambassadors. Arrangements for visiting the school

You can find out about your child's progress by:

- Attending termly parent consultations to which you will be invited.
The consultations take place once a term and give you the opportunity to discuss your child's progress with their teacher. The meeting is intended to last five minutes. However, should you need longer, this can be arranged with the class teacher for another mutually convenient date and time.
- Every Monday in term time between 3.15-4.00pm there is an opportunity to see your child's class teacher if you need a longer appointment.
- By making an appointment with the Headteacher.

Parent/Carers wishing to visit the school in connection with the possible admission of their child are invited to do so by making an appointment with the Headteacher.

Attendance and Punctuality

Thank you for your support and co-operation. The children's punctuality and attendance is essential to ensuring high standards of learning. To keep you informed a letter will be sent to you at the beginning of each half term detailing your child's percentage attendance. We are aware of any extenuating circumstances as to why a child's attendance may appear low. Attendance is also discussed at Open Occasions and is noted on children's end of year reports. Please see the school website for the Attendance Policy and Procedures. Thank you so much for your support around attendance. At the end of the summer term Attendance figures are at 94%.

Reminder

If your child is ill please contact the school office on the first day of absence. You will receive a call from the school office if you have not contacted school with a reason for absence. Medical evidence may be required if your child's absence falls below 90%.

Attendance and Leave of Absence Policies can be found on our website. As you will see from the policy all requests for leave of absence in term time should be made using schools leave of absence in term time request form and evidence of the exceptional circumstances must be provided for all requests and attached to the form.

Where a pupil is absent from school without the permission of the school, the parent/carer of the pupil may be issued with a £60 penalty notice per parent per child. If the notice remains unpaid after 21 days the penalty increases to £120. If the notice remains unpaid after 28 days the Local Authority may commence proceedings under section 444 (1) of the 1996 Education Act in the Magistrates Court.

Administration of Medicine

Medicines can only be administered by trained staff. If your child requires medicine to be administered during the school day you are welcome to come in and administer the medicine if you prefer. If a member of staff is to administer medicine, a parental agreement form must be completed beforehand. For practical reasons we ask that you arrange to come into school at 8.30am or 3.00-3.30pm and a trained member of staff will be available to provide you with an agreement form. If you are bringing in medication please ensure that it is in date, in the original container, marked with a pharmacy label, stating the child's name, the type of medicine and the required dosage and storage instructions. The medicine container also needs to be in a plastic box with a lid and labelled with the child's name.

Guidance from HBC is that medication should only be brought into school when essential i.e. where it would be detrimental to a child's health if the medicine were not administered during the school day. Their advice is that wherever possible parents should administer medication outside of school hours for example if the medication only has to be taken three times a day.

Reminder Health and Safety

Our School site which includes the playground is designated as a no smoking area. Please do not smoke on school premises, including the playground as you will be politely asked to extinguish the cigarette.

No dogs are allowed on the playground. Even the gentlest of animals can bite when excited. Also please do not leave dogs unattended and tied to the railings. Again you will be politely reminded of the need to stay with the dog at all times.

Before and after school, children should stay close to their parents. Please take extra special care in the car parking areas. Thank you as always for your co-operation.
