It had a big heart on it to show her how much they loved her and lots of candles. Little Red Hen was very surprised and after they had played some games and sang Happy Birthday, Little Red Hen and her friends made a birthday wish. I wonder what it was?

Things to do.....

Act out the story of The Little Red Hen - you might use some toys and change the characters!

Make a birthday card for Little Red Hen. Trace the words and write your name. Draw or make a birthday cake for Little Red Hen. You could make the cake out of playdough.

You and your toys could have a birthday party for Little Red Hen. Don't forget to sing Happy Birthday!

Easy to Make No Cook Playdough

You will need:

2 cups of flour
2 cups of salt
1 cup of cold water
A desert spoon of cooking oil
Food colouring

- Put the flour and salt into a large bowl and mix them together.
- Add the water, oil and food colouring to the flour and salt.
- Mix everything together
- Knead the stiff mixture to make a ball.
- Put playdough in an airtight container to keep it soft.

Things to do.....

- Make finger puppets. Cut them out and colour them in. Use your puppets to act out your nursery rhymes.

Now let's make Incy Wincy Spider.



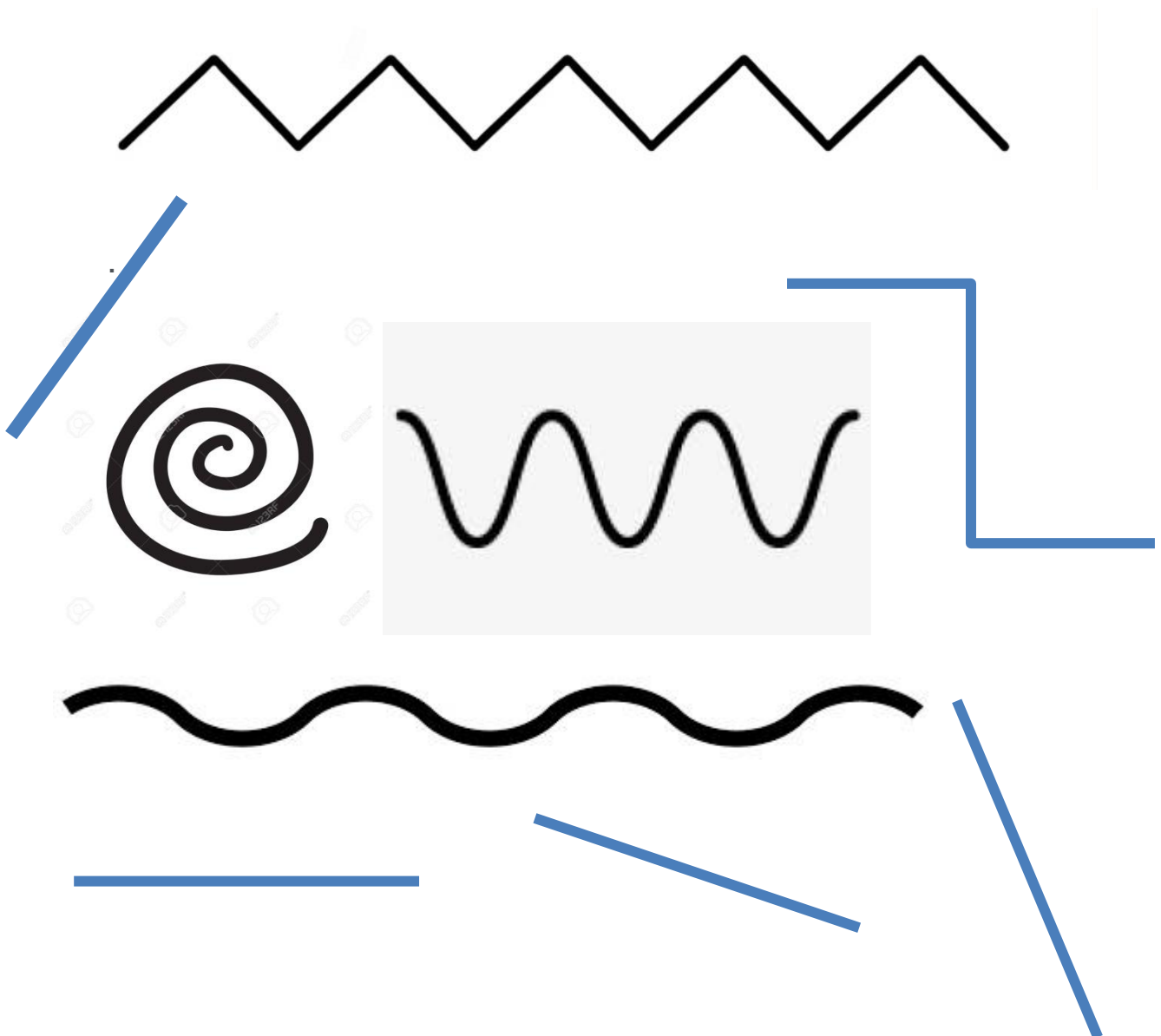
You will need.....

- Paper
- Scissors -
- Glue
- Maybe some ribbon or string
- Something to draw and colour with.

1 Draw a big round shape for Incy Wincy's body and cut it out. Are you using scissors safely and holding them correctly?

2 Cut strips of paper for the legs and stick them on.

3 Give your spider 2 big eyes and make different patterns on his/her body. You could do swirly pattern, zig-zag patterns, wavy patterns and straight lines.



4 Attach another strip of paper or a piece of string or ribbon so you can hold on to it as you move your spider.

Now use your spider as you sayIncy, Wincy Spider climbing up the spout.....

Have fun and no scaring people with those spiders, now!!!
